PAST RESEARCH

Masterstrokes of Faith

Architectural research into the vernacular, historical context, and religious symbolism of Patrick Keely's Holy Cross Cathedral and H. H. Richardson's Trinity Church. The illustrated essay concentrated on the contrast between neoGothic and Richardsonian-Romanesque architectural styles in the Gilded Age.

The Adaptation of Architectural Form in Beijing 1949-1959

Research on the architectural typologies found within China directly after the founding of the People's Republic in 1949. Attention was given to the city of Beijing and the influence of Soviet models as foundations which modern Chinese style was created.

Landscapes of Shame

Research on the architectural symbols within cemetery design, specifically regarding the marking of shameful events or people. An illustrated essay was completed to report these initial findings.

Landscape Symbolism of Imperial Rome

Research work completed in fulfillment of an Honors Research Thesis in Landscape Architecture. The work presents the symbolic intent of public space in Rome during the fall of the Republic (61 -2 BC), specifically focusing on three large forum developments during this period.

Post-Industrial Landscapes: The Brass Valley

Academic research focused on the cultural controversies of industrial centers as they deal with modern society. A series of essays were written which chronicle "The Brass Valley", a group of small industrial cities resting along the Housatonic River.
